I. Opening of Meeting and Roll Call

Chairman Mike Millette called the meeting to order at 1:01 pm. Gretchen Klock called the role.

II. Remote Attendance Requests

Mayor Todd Latham representing the City of Sandwich, Scott Marquardt representing the Village of Campton Hills, and Mike Pubentz representing the City of Elgin requested permission to participate remotely. This request was approved by the committee.

III. Approval of July 25th, 2024 Meeting Minutes

Jennifer Hughes of Oswego made a motion to approve the meeting minutes, Brian Merkel of Sugar Grove seconded, and the motion passed unanimously by voice vote.

IV. Public Comment on Agenda Items

No public comment was made about the agenda.

V. General Business

A. Socioeconomic Forecast

Alex Bahls delivered a presentation on CMAP's Socioeconomic Forecast. This report consists of a regional forecast, which was the subject of this presentation, and a local forecast which will be developed later. The forecast models births, deaths, migration, and jobs with a 2025 horizon year. The draft regional forecast shows that the CMAP region will still grow, but at a slower rate than present. The current 2035 forecast from the Illinois Department of Public Health shows population in Illinois and Cook County decreasing, but population in the collar counties increasing. Alex noted that KKCOM has not selected a representative for the local forecast task force and asked anyone interested to reach out to Heidi Lichtenberger.

Alex fielded multiple questions from the committee. He estimated a draft being available in Spring 2025 with a more final version in late 2025 ahead of the project's required completion date of October 2026. Alex stated the practical applications of this project is use in travel modeling which affects points awarded in project scoring. Alex added the data in the forecast is broken down in to 5-year age brackets and broken apart by sex. Alex clarified that data from the Congressional Budget Office is for economic and job forecasting and that data from the 2020 census is not solely relied on for population forecasting. Moody's Analytics data includes data beyond the census and is used resulting in CMAP projecting more growth than other estimates.

B. Speed Management Report

Victoria Barrett delivered a presentation on CMAP's Speed Management Report. The report and executive summary are available on CMAP's website. This project is a part of CMAP's Safe Travel for All (STAR) 5-year effort. The Speed Management Report addresses the trend of traffic fatalities in Northeastern Illinois increasing since 2014. The project has found that bicycle & pedestrian deaths have increased as well and are highly related to speeding. The project reports that 46% of fatal crashes in the study area have speed as a factor and most of these crashes happen on 30mph roads. The primary recommendation of the study is to improve roadway design to reduce speeding and exposure to safety risks. The project also recommends reducing speed limits in urban areas and supporting better safe driving education and equitable enforcement.

Victoria answered multiple questions from the committee. In response to a concern that lowering speed limits does not lead to an actually lowered speed, Victoria emphasized the focus on road design but also noted studies in Seattle and Washington DC that showed reductions in speed travelled with a reduction in urban speed limit. Victoria noted that the effect of cell phone use on speeding is underreported and hard for police officers to attribute a crash to. Victoria mentioned that on the national level, NHTSA currently has a public comment period open on a new proposed rule to incorporate pedestrian collision testing in vehicle safety ratings.

C. Planning Liaison Update – George Kandathil of KKCOM delivered the update.

IDOT will update as well as elicit input from stakeholders including state and municipal agencies, elected officials, and the public in order to improve public transportation quality. 2023 IDOT National Highway System (NHS) pavement and bridge data

Proposed 2025 Budget Released by Pace Bus

On September 18th, 2024, Pace released its proposed 2025 budget at its Board of Directors' meeting. The budget spells out the coming year's plan for operating costs and capital investments. Highlights of the 2025 budget include a replete capital program and fully funded operational budgets for both fixed route and paratransit services, with no fare increases or reductions in service. The public will have the opportunity learn about and comment on the budget starting on October 17, 2024, when Pace will hold a series of in-person and virtual public hearings to present its proposed 2025 Operating Budget, 2026-2027 Two-Year Financial Plan, and 2025-2029 Five-Year Capital Program. D. CMAP Report

Jon Haadsma delivered the CMAP Report. Jon stated that the CMAP CFP for STP-Shared, CMAQ/CRP, and TAP-L funding sources opens Monday, October 21st and closes December 20th at 5pm. He recommended municipalities submit their applications to KKCOM one or two weeks before the deadline for review. Jon added that there will be an online webinar October 30th at 10am focused on eligibility, scoring, methodology, and Q&A for the CFP. Jon encouraged municipalities to complete the CMAP Municipal Survey that is closing October 18th. Jon stated that CMAP launched a regional ADA coordinator group that is having its first meeting November 19th from 9:30-11:00am in a hybrid format.

Jon answered questions from the committee. He estimated that the STP-Shared fund mark is about \$30 million per year for 5 years. Jon stated that the RAISE grant call for project timeframe has not been announced. Jackie Forbes of KKCOM added that the recipients of the last call were just announced and the next application cycle would likely be Spring 2025.

VI. Surface Transportation Program (STP)

A. FFY 2024 Summary and FFY 2025 Updates

Heidi Lichtenberger reported that in 2024, the council had a mark of \$18,048,779 and obligated \$15,188,926 leaving \$2,859,853 unobligated and thus was unable to access regional redistribution funds. Heidi noted that there is a high volume of projects in 2025. In FFY 2025,

the Council's spend-don policy will no longer be in effect. The council will continue the old method of cost increases requests. Projects can request over the NTE amount on a case-by-case basis. Heidi asked municipalities to look over the posted program and contact her and George Kandathil with any inaccuracies.

B. Current FFY24-28 STP-L Active and Contingency Programs

Heidi Lichtenberger presented eight projects approved by KKCOM to move from the contingency list to the FFY 2025 active list. If these projects failed to submit draft agreements by July 28th (D1) or August 8th (D3), the projects would return to the contingency list. Chairman Mike Millette asked for a motion to approve moving these projects to the active list. A motion was made by Rich Babica of Geneva and seconded by Brad Merkel of Sugar Grove. The motion passed unanimously by roll call vote.

C. City of Sandwich Cost Increase Request (09-22-0028)

Heidi Lichtenberger presented a cost increase request from the City of Sandwich for their Main Street road improvement project. The project was partially funded in 2022 and is requesting a cost increase and to exceed the NTE amount. Chairman Mike Millette asked for a motion to approve this cost increase. A motion was made by Mike Rennels of Plano and seconded by Jennifer Hughes of Oswego. The motion passed unanimously by roll call vote, with Mayor Latham of the City of Sandwich abstaining.

D. Current FFY25-29 STP-L Active and Contingency Programs

Chairman Mike Millette asked for a motion to approve the current FFY2025-2029 STP-L Active and Contingency programs. A motion was made by Fran Klaas of Kendall County and seconded by Brad Merkel of Sugar Grove. Heidi Lichtenberger asked municipalities to look over their projects and to contact herself and George Kandathil if there are any errors. The motion passed unanimously by roll call vote.

E. IDOT STP Report

Marilin Solomon gave the IDOT STP Report. She noted that estimated design approval dates are provided on the IDOT status sheets. Marilin gave a reminder that if there is a project receiving STP funding that is not in the status sheet, email Marilin with the most recent approved PPI and project milestone sheet.

Katie Herdus from IDOT presented the 2025-2030 Proposed Highway Improvement Program for Kane and Kendall counties. She noted that changes are in bold print and that there will be additional resurfacing projects that will be moving in to 2025 and will be added to the program in March or April 2025.

VII. Other Business

Mike Millette gave project updates for South Elgin. IL Route 31 drainage project is anticipated to open November 15th, 2024. McClean Boulevard will remain closed.

VIII. Public Comments

There was no public comment.

Funding Opportunities:

USDOT FY 2025 RAISE Grant Opportunity

The U.S. Department of Transportation (USDOT) Rebuilding American Infrastructure with Sustainability and Equity (RAISE) program provides grants for surface transportation infrastructure projects with significant local or regional impact. Funding minimums for RAISE grant awards are \$5 million for projects in urban areas and \$1 million for those in rural areas. There is no minimum award amount for planning grants. The maximum award size for both capital and planning grants is \$25 million. More information about this opportunity can be found here: <u>RAISE Notice of Funding</u> Opportunity. Complete instructions on how to register and apply can be found at Grants.gov: RAISE Grant. Application for Round 2 are due January 30th and awards are expected to be announced by June 28, 2025.

FHWA PROTECT Grant Opportunity

Information for the 2024 – 26 cycle of the Promoting Resilient Operations for Transformative, Efficient, and Cost-Saving Transportation (PROTECT) Discretionary Grant Program, is now available online. This grant program was created by the Bipartisan Infrastructure Law to help make surface transportation more resilient to natural hazards, including climate change, sea level rise, flooding, extreme weather events, and other natural disasters. This funding cycle offers a total of up to \$876 million in funding through two application periods, including up to \$576 million for FYs 2024 and 2025, and up to \$300 million for FY 2026. The FY 2024-2025 application period will remain open through February 24th. RTA Board Approves 2025 Regional Operating Budget

RTA Board of Directors voted to adopt the <u>2025 regional transit operating budget and 2025-2029 capital program</u>, the last one supported by federal COVID relief dollars. The 2025 budget includes \$4.147 billion in operating expenses, and a 2025- 2029 Regional Capital Program of \$9.469 billion: <u>RTA Budget</u>.

CTA Launches Long-Term Strategic Planning Process

The Chicago Transit Authority (CTA) announced the launch of a planning process to determine the strategic direction for the agency over the next several years. As part of the process, the public is invited to share their opinions as well as receive updates on other opportunities to engage through the webpage <u>Powering our Transit</u> <u>Future</u>. Additional community forums and listening sessions will be scheduled through spring 2025. The CTA aims to release the Plan in the second half of 2025.

ReVision: Pace's Network Restructuring Project

Pace is seeking to update the region's bus network to reflect how travel patterns have changed, building on the principles of accessibility, equity, and productivity. As part of this effort, Pace is gathering public input through open houses and a short survey. This project is developing a proposal for a reimagined fixed route and on-demand network, which will lead to major service changes in 2026. A recently released <u>public survey</u> regarding Pace's transit concept maps can be filled out online. The Pace team will propose a Draft Plan for public comment in mid-2025 with a Final Plan developed for implementation in late-2025. The Tollway has established a Stakeholder Advisory Team to assist with defining program goals and providing regional input for the next capital plan, as well as a Strategic Planning Committee, a Board-level committee overseeing the agency's strategic and capital planning process with a goal of delivering plans in 2025.

I-PASS Sticker Tags

This summer, the Tollway has begun to mail I-PASS Sticker Tags directly to customers when their current I-PASS transponders expire. I-PASS Sticker Tags are the new, more efficient and cost-effective transponder technology.

In addition, I-PASS Sticker Tags can still be picked up at Illinois Tollway Customer Service Centers ordered online via the Illinois Tollway <u>website</u> or at a Jewel-Osco or RoadRanger retail location.

Customers will not be required to switch to the I-PASS Sticker Tag as long as they have a working transponder.

There is no deposit fee for I-PASS Sticker Tags. For customers with current transponders, the \$10 transponder deposit will be transferred into their pre-paid toll accounts once a new I-PASS Sticker Tag is registered to the account.

The introduction of I-PASS Sticker Tags is being done in collaboration with other E-ZPass agencies and will ensure that customers have continuity in service wherever they travel in the 19 states that are part of the E-ZPass consortium.

I-PASS Assist

The Illinois Tollway's I-PASS Assist program continuing to provide more assistance than ever.

Income-eligible drivers are receiving the cost-saving benefits of I-PASS after signing up for I-PASS Assist Accounts that also offer few up-front costs. In addition, I-PASS Assist customers may be eligible to have invoice fees dismissed once enrolled.

We've put together a tool kit <u>I-PASS Assist Communications Toolkit - Illinois Tollway</u> if you'd like to promote this program to your residents.

To be eligible for enrollment in I-PASS Assist, household income must not exceed 250% of Federal Poverty Guidelines as verified by the Illinois Department of Revenue or qualified by the Illinois Department of Human Services for cash and food assistance programs.

RE:	Regional Redistribution Fund & Cost Increases

KKCOM receives a yearly STP-L mark for each FFY which is set by CMAP. The KKCOM mark for FFY 2025 is \$12,619,870 which is projected to be fully authorized by the March 2025 letting. CMAP currently has a large balance of their regional redistribution fund so they are allowing councils to utilize these funds in FFY 2025. This was first introduced to the Transportation Policy Committee in October 2023. The 11 subregional councils and Cook County have access to this fund. As of now, KKCOM is projected to use \$43.4 million of the regional redistribution fund in FFY 2025.

Currently, KKCOM has 25 projects totaling approximately \$56 million programmed in FFY 2025. This includes the \$12.6 million mark plus \$43.4 million of the regional redistribution fund. (Details can be found on the following page).

Cost increases are encouraged if needed, contingent on a FFY 2025 letting. As a reminder, here are the guidelines for cost increases.

Cost increases:

- Cost increase requests accepted after pre-final plan submittal and prior to Final PS&E and Draft Agreement(s) submittal.
- Roadways & Intersections projects can request up to 80% of CON/CE cost, NTE \$2.5 million.
- Asset Management projects can request up to 75% of CON/CE cost, NTE original awarded amount (\$500,000, \$750,000, or \$1,000,000).
- Projects originally programmed in 2025 to get priority.
- As a reminder, cost increases less than or equal to 5% of the original approved funding level will require the project sponsor to submit a request for KKCOM staff approval. Project cost increases greater than 5% will require the project sponsor to submit a request for approval from the Transportation Policy Committee.
- Projects requesting over the NTE will be considered on a case-by-case basis and will require TPC approval.

Please contact KKCOM staff if you need further guidance for a potential cost increase.

Work has been completed for the Latham Street Reconstruction Project (Center Street to North of Sandhurst Drive). The project included roadway reclamation, new storm sewer, partial water main replacement, sanitary sewer repairs, HMA pavement and shoulders, stormwater conveyance improvements, sidewalk repairs and ADA corners, pavement marking, and landscaping.

The City has currently been awarded \$1,709,430.00 in STP-L funding for construction and \$105,570.00 for construction engineering This STP-L funding includes \$781,854.24 in KKCOM when the City was brought into the CMAP.

Due to unforeseen circumstances resulting from delays in utility work the project was delayed by over two years, due to that delay additional costs were incurred for the project. We have an attached estimate from Berger Construction showing a 2-year escalation estimate for construction delay costs of \$205,591 in addition to \$122,750.55 in contract extras that were required to complete the project. Also due to the additional time required to complete the project an additional \$47,980 in additional Construction Engineering was required for project completion.

The City of Sandwich respectfully requests an increase in STP-L funding of \$452,725.00. This includes additional projects needs at the 80 / 20 split. The request is for a total STP-L award of \$2,267,725 from the \$1,815,000 originally awarded.
