I. Opening of Meeting and Roll Call

Chairman Mayor Schielke called the meeting to order at 9:35 a.m. George Kandathil called the role.

II. Remote Attendance Requests

Tim Weidner of Aurora, Phil Cotter of East Dundee, and Mike Millette of South Elgin requested remote participation. The requests were approved unanimously by voice vote.

III. Approval of Meeting Minutes

Scott Marquardt of Campton Hills made a motion to approve the meeting minutes. Ron Rudd of Elgin seconded and the motion passed unanimously by voice vote.

IV. Public Comments

There were no public comments.

V. Presentation

Kendra Johnson from the RTA presented "Transforming Transit—Vision for Chicago's Future." This vision for the future of regional transit was officially released in February. Kendra spoke about the upcoming transit fiscal cliff which would cause service cuts in the start of 2026 if new funding isn't identified. RTA's vision is based on \$1.5 billion dollars of funding per year for the transit system. This would allow faster and more frequent service for all three service boards. She added that funding increase must come with reform measures to restructure the agency for greater efficiency and accountability. Possible improvements may include creating one payment app system, better service standards, and a regional approach to capital planning. RTA also desires to increase safety and is asking for funding for more police and social services for the transit system. The RTA proposes a 10% fare increase and efficiencies and savings due to reform could total an estimated \$100 million in revenue and savings.

Kendra stated that the region has faced financial difficulties before regarding transit, but never to this magnitude. Cuts to service could include no weekend bus service in suburbs and may lead to an estimated 3000 jobs being lost.

Kendra highlighted other RTA outreach efforts on this topic including the Transforming Transit Summit, for which panel recordings are available online, and the Save Transit Now campaign. Kendra also shared a Callto-Action tool kit.

Kendra shared the upcoming deadlines for the Illinois General Assembly including the adjournment of session on May 31st.

Mayor Schielke spoke about concerns over transit board restructuring that would favor Cook County and Chicago. He stated that he has been vocal about making sure suburban communities are fairly represented. He spoke in favor of the RTA's vision and plan.

VI. Action Items

A. Election of Officers

Heidi Lichtenberger stated that according to the bylaws the Chairman and Vice-Chairman shall be elected every odd-number year. A nominating committee of Fran Klaas from Kendall, Jeff Walter from Elburn, and Mike Reid from Hampshire agreed on a slate of Mayor Schielke as Chairman and President Skillman as Vice Chairman. Mike Millette of South Elgin made a motion to approve the election, seconded by Chris Gottlieb. The motion passed unanimously by voice vote.

B. Appointment of Transportation Policy Committee Chair

There were no additional nominees for Transportation Policy Committee Chair. Mayor Schielke reappointed Mike Millette of South Elgin as chairman. Mike Millette expressed his thanks.

C. Impact Fee Advisory Committee Nominations

Heidi files presented the memo on the Impact Fee Advisory Committee nominations. In accordance with State

law Kane County must update its land use assumptions, Comprehensive Road Improvement Plan, Road Impact Fee Ordinance and Impact Fee schedule every five years. Kane County is looking for three municipal members of the Impact Fee Advisory Committee. The three proposed members are Mayor Schielke of Batavia, with Mayor-Elect Clint Hull of St. Charles as an alternate; President Michael Reid of Hampshire with Village Manager Jay hedges of Hampshire as an alternate; and President John Skillman of Carpentersville with the Carpentersville village manager as an alternate. There were no other nominations and the nominations passed unanimously by voice vote.

D. Annual Planning Liaison Resolution

Heidi Lichtenberger presented the annual Planning Liaison Resolution. This resolution reallocates Fiscal Year 2026 Federal Transportation Planning Funds to the Kane County Division of Transportation to provide staff assistance to KKCOM. Mike Zakosek of Kane County made a motion to approve the resolution, seconded by Ron Rudd of Elgin. The motion passed unanimously by voice vote.

E. Adoption of the FFY 2025-2029 STP Active and Contingency Programs

Mike Millette, Transportation Policy Committee chairman, presented the current FFY2025-2029 STP Active and Contingency programs. He noted that the council has been successful at accessing regional redistribution funds and the Council's mark has been succeeded. Phil Cotter of East Dundee made a motion to approve the programs, which was seconded by Brian Schiber of Sugar Grove. The motion passed unanimously by voice vote.

RTA Releases Vision: Transforming Transit

The Regional Transportation Authority of Northeastern Illinois (RTA) released "Transforming Transit," a \$1.5 billion vision aimed at shaping the future of transit funding and governance which must resolve transit's historic funding gap. The Illinois legislature must put forth a sustainable funding solution by this May to avoid service cuts and fare increases at catastrophic and unprecedented levels. "We know our riders deserve world-class service. To provide it, we need to secure sustainable funding. And this document describes exactly what our riders and our region could get out of this level of investment," said RTA Executive Director Leanne Redden.

CMAP's Regional Transportation Plan Survey

Kane County Safety Action Plan Update

The Kane County Safety Action Plan steering committee is anticipated to begin reviewing the draft Safety Action Plan on May 9th. The plan is anticipated to be approved on May 30th by a special meeting of the CMAP MPO Policy Committee. Pending approval of the Safety Action Plan, municipalities in Kane County will be eligible to apply for the <u>Safe Streets for All Grants (SS4A) Program</u>. Planning and Implementation Grant applications must be submitted by 4:00 p.m. (CST) on **June 26, 2025.**

B. Council of Mayors Executive Committee Report

Mayor Schielke, Chairman of the CMAP Council of Mayors Executive Committee, shared an update on the meetings of the committee. The committee heard presentations from the national Weather Service about increasing severe weather, CMAP's resiliency efforts, and EV readiness. The committee will be joined by new members in June. Mayor Schielke also shared updates from the MPO Committee noting that the UWP program was approved in January. The committee also discussed CMAP's request for an appropriation from the State for providing more municipal support.

C. IDOT Local Roads update

There was no report from Local Roads.

D. CMAP Report

Kama Dobbs of CMAP shared the CMAP report. CMAP is asking municipalities to contribute to the Northeastern Illinois Development Database. This database informs CMAP's socioeconomic forecasting and modeling efforts. Kama shared that the Regional Transportation Plan (RTP) is open and all residents are encouraged to contribute. The public comment period for the STP Shared Fund proposed program closes May 2nd. Kama commended KKCOM for obligating funding and accessing redistribution funds. She added that it is good for the region to not have a large balance of unused funds when reauthorization conversations begin with the federal government.

E. Transportation Improvement Program update

A. IDOT Program Report District 1

Katie Herdus of IDOT shared the IDOT D1 program report. They are still waiting to see when IDOT's MYP is released. Katie shared updates to the Spring repair program including 5 projects in Kane County that were added or moved up. Construction on these projects will begin this summer.

B. IDOT Program Report District 3

There was no report from IDOT District 3.

C. Illinois State Toll Highway Authority Report

The Illinois State Toll Highway Authority report is in the packet.

D. RTA Report

Kendra Johnson of IDOT commended Jackie Forbes for her work on the RTA board and as Chair of the Citizens' Advisory board. She added that the April report is in the packet. The May report will be finalized soon and sent out.

E. Metra Report

Demetri Skoufis of Metra echoed the RTA's messages about the potential service cuts. He noted that ridership has been going up with higher ridership in March than budgeted. Metra noted their highest ridership weekend ever occurred last St. Patrick's Day with over 164,000 riders. Also noted that the Ventra app is doing well and

growing users. He added that the UP third main line project should be done spring/summer of 2025.

F. Pace Report

Steve Andrews gave the Pace Report. Pace is seeing positive trends in ridership growth, compared to 2024. Service on expressways, PULSE service, and other arterials are seeing the highest growth. He added that the Pace Board approve the Regional Day Pass program. Pace has been developing a draft network plan for multiple different scenarios, including funding increases and status quo funding. Steve introduced Jocelyn Lopez who is the new Community relations staff member for KKCOM.

G. Kane county Report

Steve Coffinbargar of Kane County shared some project updates on the projects in the KKCOM STP-L programming. Randall at IL 72 is on the September letting assuming ROW does not cause any delays. Now that Longmeadow Parkway is completed, Randall at Hopps is now the top priority project for KDOT and is anticipated to let in Fall 2026. Randall at Big Timber is anticipated to let in June 2026 and begin construction in 2027.

Fran Klaas stated there was no report from Kendall County.
