I. Opening of Meeting and Roll Call

Chairman Mayor Jeffery Schielke called the meeting to order at 1:31 pm. Everyone in the room and online introduced themselves. Mayor Schielke gave some remarks about the building's history.

II. Remote Attendance Requests

There were no requests for remote participation.

III. Approval of April 25th, 2024 Meeting Minutes

The motion to approve the meeting minutes passed unanimously by voice vote.

IV. Public Comment

Mayor Schielke talked about the recent Metropolitan Mayor's Caucus meeting where they discussed the fiscal cliff and governance of the RTA. He encouraged municipalities to keep an eye on these topics as they develop.

V. Presentation

A. Amtrak

Matt Swiantek and Chris Damian from Amtrak gave a presentation on Amtrak's Chicago Hub Improvement Program (CHIP). The CHIP consists of Chicago Union Station improvements and Chicago Infrastructure Improvements. In Union Station, Amtrak intends to increase platform capacity for both Amtrak and Metra, reactivate the old mail platform, improve ventilation, and improve the concourses. Amtrak's infrastructure improvements include expanding yard storage capacity, creating a new connection ramp to the St. Charles Air Line Bridge, addressing the South Branch Bridge, and double tracking a section of track in Michigan. Chris explained the project's funding. Amtrak is applying for FRA- Federal State Partnership for Intercity Passenger Rail FSP Grant Program. They are requesting a letter of support from KKCOM or individual Mayors to be submitted by Friday December 13th.

Matt and Chris answered questions from the council. Matt clarified how this project is relevant to Kane and Kendall counties since it increases capacity in Union Station for Metra lines which serve the suburbs.

VI. Rockford Intercity Passenger Rail

Jackie Forbes provided an update on the development of the Rockford Intercity Passenger Rail. Jackie and Mayor Schielke met with representatives from IDOT and Metra about the new service to Rockford. Jackie will share resources including the project's website, and narrated slideshow after this meeting. Jackie explained that IDOT has a section dedicated to rail and transit. Illinois state rail service is operated by Amtrak but run by IDOT. As a part of Governor Pritzker's \$275 million Rebuild Illinois Capital Plan, IDOT received funds to reinstate passenger rail from Chicago to Rockford. No RTA sales tax funds will be involved. Metra was chosen to operate the service. The host railroad will be Metra from Chicago to Elgin and Union Pacific from Elgin to Rockford.

Demetri Skoufis from Metra added that Metra was chosen as the service operator as they are already operating service from Chicago to Elgin. However, the Rockford service will be completely separate from Metra's budget and will have a different ticket/fare system and different branding. Demetri added that IDOT is open to other opportunities and municipalities can put other projects on their radar such as Chicago to Oswego or Chicago to Dekalb service. Fran Klaas of Kendall County asked if there are published estimates of ridership yet. Demetri and Jackie were not aware of any. Demetri noted that it is hard to calculate anticipated ridership since the Rockford service will be limited service with only 2 round-trips per day.

VII. Action Items

A. Adoption of the FFY 2025-2029 STP Active and Contingency Programs

Heidi Lichtenberger presented the FFY 2025-20209 STP Active and Contingency Programs. Carl Schoedel of Kane County made a motion to approve, John Skillman of Carpentersville seconded and the motion passed unanimously by voice vote.

VIII. General Business

A. Council Director's Report

Heidi Lichtenberger delivered the Council Director's Report. Heidi congratulated Carl Schoedel on his upcoming retirement and congratulated Mike Zakosek on his appointment as the new County Engineer. Mayor Schielke commended Carl for his service and leadership on behalf of the Council.

B. Council Chair and Vice Chair Nominating Committee

Heidi Lichtenberger explained the process for nominating and electing the Chairman and Vice-Chairman. Any member wishing to participate on the three-person nominating committee can contact KKCOM staff to be considered. The nominating committee will present their nomination at the next Full Council meeting for the Full Council to vote on.

C. Kane County Safety Action Plan Update

Jackie Forbes demonstrated the Kane County Safety Action Plan website. Six of the counties (not including Kendall) are creating safety action plans through a federal grant secured by CMAP. Having a safety action plan in place will allow municipalities to apply for further grants to implement the plan. The consultants are developing a draft high injury network and are emphasizing both urban and rural crashes. The website has a survey and interactive map to post comments on.

D. Council of Mayors Executive Committee Report

Chairman Schielke recapped the actions of the CMAP Council of Mayors Executive Committee for the past year. The council provided input on CMAP's socio-economic forecasts, Regional Transportation Plan, and county safety action plans. CMAP has worked to refresh the structure of the Council of Mayors Executive Committee. The next meeting on January 14th will discuss severe weather trends in the region. Mayor Schielke emphasized the importance on studying and planning for changes to weather patterns in the area.

E. IDOT Local Roads Update

Marilin Solomon presented the IDOT status sheets. She asked municipalities to email her if a project has an approved PPI but is not in the status sheets and to provide a project milestone schedule. Marilin added that requests for kick-off meetings should be organized through the planning liaisons. Marilin gave a reminder that local agencies receiving Rebuild IL funds must have the funding authorized by July 1st, 2025.

F. CMAP Report

Jon Haadsma gave the CMAP report. He reiterated that the CMAP call-for-projects deadline is December 9th which gives the planning liaisons time to review the applications before the final deadline of December 20th. Jon stated that CMAP recently published the Climate Risk-Based Vulnerability Assessment and has published the corresponding online on CMAP's data hub.

G. Transportation Improvement Program Update

• IDOT Program Report District 1: Katie Herdus was not present.

- IDOT Program Report District 3: Ryan Lindenmier was not present.
- Illinois State Toll Highway Report: Kelsey Passi recapped that in the past year the
 Tollway launched stickers to replace the transponders in collaboration with EZ-Pass
 states. She also reminded everyone of the I-Pass Assist program that helps qualifying
 households eliminate fines. Kelsey encouraged municipalities to contact her at
 Kpassi@get.ipass.com to partner with the Tollway for a local event.
- RTA Report: Kendra Johnson stated there are two more hearings for the RTA's budget. She noted that resources and recordings from the October Transit Summit are available online. RTA is also seeking feedback on the data they have available online.
- Metra Report: Demetri Skoufis of Metra added on to the previous Amtrak presentation regarding the relevancy of the project to Kane and Kendall. Demetri referenced the CREATE program which works with the railroads to fund rail projects in the region. CREATE identified 72 projects to untangle rail connections and roads and works to partner to implement those projects. He explained one proposed project to untangle a connection and bring Metra's Southwest Service to the Oak Lawn, Palos and Orlin Park communities. This would reroute the Southwest Service to Metra's LaSalle Street terminal and free up capacity in Union Station for potential service to Oswego. Amtrak's projects to increase capacity at Union Station will also increase the feasibly of the Oswego service study. Demetri recommended that the CREATE program present for the Full Council. Demetri stated that the Metra Board passed the 2025 budget in November with no fare increases or service changes. The Union Pacific third main project in Geneva is wrapping up and should be done in the spring.
- Pace Report: Chris Rose reported that Pace developed a balanced budget for both suburban and ADA paratransit service with no fare increases or cuts to service. Pace has launched a new app for paratransit riders, expanded Ventra payment to ADA paratransit and dial-a-ride trips, adopted the Rideshare Access Program and continued to support Ride-in-Kane. Pace is continuing to collaborate with RTA, CTA, and Metra to develop a regional day pass. Pace has seen a recent surge in ridership ADA paratransit ridership is above pre-pandemic levels. Pace is seeking input for Pace ReVision and has draft maps and a survey available online. The capital portion of the budget includes funds for zero-emission buses and expanding Pace's garage in Elgin.
- Kane County Report: Carl Schoedel gave updates for Kane County. The Fabyan Parkway and Western Avenue intersection improvement is nearly complete. The Dauberman Road extension opened in October. The Longmeadow ribbon cutting was held in late August. Carl recounted that when he started working for Kane County, the county board presented the challenge of completing five priority projects. With the opening of Longmeadow Parkway in the fall, all five projects have been completed. Carl thanked the Council for their support. The Council commended Carl for his years of service and congratulated him on his upcoming retirement at the end of January.
- Kendall County Report: There were no updates from Fran Klaas.
- Municipal Reports: There were no municipal reports.

IX. Other Business

There was no other business.

X. Next meeting

The next meeting is likely to be in the spring after the mayoral elections. Jackie Forbes mentioned there may be 2 meetings in the spring to comply with the CMAQ/TAP-L/STP-Shared Fund timeline.

XI. Adjournment

Carl Schoedel of Kane County made a motion to adjourn, Brian Schiber seconded and the motion passed unanimously by voice vote. The meeting was adjourned at 3:01pm.

In accordance with Road Improvement Impact Fee Law, Kane County must update land use assumptions, the Comprehensive Road Improvement Plan (CRIP), the Road Improvement Impact Fee Ordinance, and Impact Fee Schedule prior to January 2027 (or every 5 years). The statute outlines the update process and includes a schedule and requirements consisting of an Impact Fee Advisory Committee (IFAC) and public hearings. In accordance with the statute, the Kane County IFAC membership must consist of representatives from the real estate, development, and building industries and the labor communities, the municipalities and the County Board.

The Kane Kendall Council of Mayors receives federal transportation planning funds to perform various planning and programming activities for Kane County and Kendall County. The Chicago Metropolitan Agency for Planning (CMAP) directs these funds to the Kane County Division of Transportation so that Kane County may continue to provide transportation planning staff to the Kane Kendall Council of Mayors for regional coordination and planning activities.

Primary staff for the Council of Mayors includes:

Heidi Files, Executive Director Heidi Lichtenberger, Council Director George Kandathil, Regional Planning Liaison Gretchen Klock, Regional Planning Liaison, Bike/Ped Coordinator

KKCOM regional planning staff facilitates strategic participation by local officials in the region's transportation process as required by the Bipartisan Infrastructure Law and the Regional Planning Act. Staff also supports the Council of Mayors by providing STP and CMAQ program development and monitoring, general liaison services, technical assistance and communications assistance.

An agreement will be executed with the Chicago Metropolitan Agency for Planning for the FY2026 Planning Liaison Scope of Services. It is anticipated that Kane Kendall Council of Mayors will receive total federal funding of \$262,694.68. The local match is paid by Kane County Division of Transportation in the amount of \$65,673.67.

Staff recommends Council approval authorizing the Council Chairman to execute a resolution reallocating the Fiscal Year 2026 Federal Transportation Planning Funds to the Kane County Division of Transportation to provide Professional Staff Assistance to the Kane Kendall Council of Mayors.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the Kane Kendall Council of Mayors agrees to the following regarding professional staff assistance and disposition of the Council's Federal Transportation Planning Funds:

- 1. The Kane Kendall Council of Mayors hereby agrees that it is in the best interest and mutually advantageous to retain professional transportation planning staff to provide assistance to both the Kane Kendall Council of Mayors and the Kane County Division of Transportation.
- 2. The Kane Kendall Council of Mayors hereby re-allocates their Fiscal Year 2026 Federal Transportation Planning Funds and makes said funds available to the Kane County Division of Transportation to be used to retain professional transportation planning staff to provide technical, liaison and administrative assistance to the Kane Kendall Council of Mayors and the Kane County Division of Transportation.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Kane Kendall Council of Mayors hereby approves the FY2026 Planning Liaison Scope of Services as approved by the Council of Mayors Executive Committee.

RTA Releases Vision: Transforming Transit

The Regional Transportation Authority of Northeastern Illinois (RTA) released "Transforming Transit," a \$1.5 billion vision aimed at shaping the future of transit funding and governance which must resolve transit's historic funding gap. The Illinois legislature must put forth a sustainable funding solution by this May to avoid service cuts and fare increases at catastrophic and unprecedented levels. "We know our riders deserve world-class service. To provide it, we need to secure sustainable funding. And this document describes exactly what our riders and our region could get out of this level of investment," said RTA Executive Director Leanne Redden.

CMAP's Regional Transportation Plan Survey

CMAP news

Communities encouraged to update the Northeastern Illinois Development Database

Our region is constantly changing, with some communities experiencing rapid growth, while others experience significant changes to land uses. Since 1987, the Northeastern Illinois Development Database (NDD) has tracked significant developments and redevelopments in the seven-county northeastern Illinois region.

Municipalities are encouraged to submit proposed, in-progress, or completed developments, as all phases contribute valuable data for the model. The NDD web map is an opportunity to ensure your community's growth is accurately represented in regional forecasts. The NDD web map is tailored for local government staff to actively participate in the forecasting process by submitting and editing developments. This data informs CMAP's local forecast model, which predicts household and job placements in developments across the region.

CMAP Board approves 2025-2026 Advocacy Agenda

<u>CMAP's 2025-2026 Advocacy Agenda</u> details policy positions and priorities that can help the region address challenges, seize opportunities, and continue to thrive. Legislative priorities, at both the federal and state levels, detailed in the agenda include:

- Securing a dedicated annual appropriation from the state to support a wider range of technical assistance offerings — the region's cities, villages, and counties will benefit for years to come with a modest investment in CMAP
- Sustainably funding transportation
- Developing stronger policies that enhance climate resilience and reduce emissions and congestion
- Increasing opportunities for comprehensive planning and economic development

Regional Transportation Plan (RTP)

2024 Community Data Snapshots

The 2024 CMAP Community Data Snapshots are available. The annual snapshots provide data-driven profiles for every county, municipality, and Chicago Community Area (CCA) in our region. The snapshots include updated demographic, socioeconomic, and employment data from the American Community Survey (ACS) datasets, updated land use summaries using data from the Land Use Inventory, and updated estimated vehicle miles traveled per household. Plan of Action for Regional Transit (PART)

Since CMAP's delivery of the <u>PART report</u> to the General Assembly and Governor's Office, legislative deliberations about the future of transit funding have continued. Most recently, The Senate Transportation Committee and House Transportation: Regulations, Roads and Bridges Committee have held subject matter hearings to gather feedback on two proposals for transit reform filed this legislative session. Meanwhile, Illinois House Speaker Emanuel "Chris" Welch has established a House Public Transit Working Group to closely examine the state's public transit system and develop recommendations for improvements and funding.

One of the key transit funding recommendations included in the PART report is sales tax modernization. As a follow up to this work, CMAP partnered with the Civic Federation, the Illinois Economic Policy Institute, and the Center for Tax and Budget Accountability to author <u>Modernizing Illinois' Sales Tax: A pathway for a sustainable future</u>, which outlines the potential impacts of updating the state's sales tax system. The report — coauthored by organizations that represent a broad range of government and tax policy viewpoints — details how specific reforms could apply sales tax to more consumer services, address revenue shortfalls, and ensure sustainable funding for essential public services, including public transit. The report concludes that reform could generate nearly \$2 billion annually in new state revenue and provide much-needed financial stability for Illinois communities.

Discover historical aerial photos of the region

The Imagery Explorer showcases CMAP's large collection of historical aerial photographs of northeastern Illinois from 1970 through 1995. The archive includes 6,300 images in six of the region's counties. Historic aerial photographs are valuable resources for planning activities like landscape and land use analysis, environmental impact assessments, development projects, and education. These images provide a method for examining changes in properties, neighborhoods, and land use in general. You also can examine changes in historical, environmental, or architectural information about sites over time.

Pace launches I-290/I-88 express service study and survey

Pace Suburban Bus is conducting a <u>feasibility study</u> to evaluate potential express bus service designed to provide a fast and frequent transportation option for commuters traveling between the west suburbs and Chicago. Community input will play a vital role in shaping the study's findings, and residents, workers, and stakeholders are encouraged to participate in upcoming public meetings and/or take Pace's <u>online survey</u> to share their perspectives.

ReVision: Pace's network restructuring project

2023 IDOT National Highway System (NHS) pavement and bridge data

IDOT collects condition data on Interstate pavements annually and on non-Interstate pavements on a two-year cycle. Bridges receive a routine visual inspection at least every 2-4 years, depending on the condition. The results of the most recent NHS pavement condition assessments and bridge inspections, along with performance measures and targets, may be accessed on <u>IDOT's "Performance" webpage</u>.

2023 IDOT statewide crash data

On July 22, IDOT released <u>Circular Letter 2024-15</u> announcing that 2023 statewide crash data is now available. This information can be accessed by logging into "IDOT's Safety Portal" via this <u>link.</u> If you are a first-time user, please select "Create a New Account" and enter the required information.

Vulnerable Road User Safety Assessment (VRUSA)

The IDOT <u>Vulnerable Road User Safety Assessment (VRUSA)</u> is available for download and use. The VRUSA contains IDOT's efforts to help stakeholders identify programs and projects to address vulnerable road user safety through stakeholders' engagement and data analysis. It also outlines safety strategies based on the safe system approach with a profound consideration for equity principles. It is IDOT's intention for this document to be an important tool for stakeholders to continue to address the needs of VRU's in their communities.

To assist in the use of the VRUSA for the planning of future projects that address the safety of VRUs, a <u>VRUSA Dashboard</u> has been created that allows the user to view the results of the VRUSA data analysis in a way that can be filtered to specific areas of the state.

Illinois Tollway Update

Capital Plan – Investing in the Future

The Illinois Tollway is continuing to advance its planning process for the next major capital plan that will shape the framework for the agency's long-term capital priorities.

The Tollway established a Stakeholder Advisory Team to assist with defining program goals and providing regional input for the next capital plan, as well as a Strategic Planning Committee, a Board-level committee overseeing the agency's strategic and capital planning process with a goal of delivering plans in 2025.

The Stakeholder Advisory Team delivered its final report to the Strategic Planning Committee in December, marking a significant milestone in our planning process. This report contained the Team's value statements, priorities and a series of recommendations for the Tollway's consideration as it develops the next capital plan. This report is available on the Tollways website at www.illinoistollway.com/future.

Capital planning stakeholder outreach remains ongoing, and the Tollway looks forward to continued engagement with this organization, and we invite you to visit the Tollway's website at www.illinoistollway.com/future to learn more.

Bridging the Future

In addition to the ongoing development of the next major capital plan, the Tollway recently announced *Bridging the Future*, a \$2 billion, seven-year capital program. The program will serve as a bridge between the infrastructure investments already underway as part of the current *Move Illinois* capital program, and the needs of the agency's next major capital program.

Bridging the Future includes planning, design and construction services to address four important themes across the system:

- Connecting Infrastructure: The program will provide funding for interchange and bridge design and construction that improves interconnectivity and access to communities along the Tollway system.
- 2) **Improving Mobility**: The program will continue the Tollway's commitment to safety and mobility by supporting bridge reconstructions across the system and investing in strategic widening projects that reduce potential congestion and improve driver experience.
- 3) **Modernizing the System**: The program will ensure continued investments in system improvements and maintenance priorities by providing investments for bridge repairs, pavement rehabilitation, and funding for upgrades to Tier II plazas and Tollway facilities.
- 4) **Preparing for Tomorrow:** The program includes investments that explore the feasibility of new technologies, including allocating funds for pilot programs and studies.

Funding for the Bridging the Future capital program is not expected to require any adjustments in the Illinois Tollway's current tolling structure nor any additional debt financing beyond that already planned for the *Move Illinois* Program.

Transit agencies outline what's possible with sustainable funding and how service would be cut with no action

The RTA Board of Directors and leadership from CTA, Metra, and Pace met on Thursday, March 27 to discuss how the system could improve with sustainable funding and <u>potential service cuts</u> should the Illinois General Assembly fail to address transit's looming fiscal cliff.

Planning for cuts would begin immediately following the end of the legislative session if sustainable funding is not secured, with community meetings and public hearings held in the fall before initial cuts are included in the agency's 2026 budgets. The magnitude of these cuts is unprecedented and would require several rounds of schedule adjustments in 2026 and beyond.

The RTA and Service Boards also outlined what service improvements could come should the state make \$1.5 billion in additional investment in the region's transit system. This includes reduced headways on CTA rail and bus, a 50% increase in service on Metra, two potential service improvement models described in Pace's ReVision plan. The RTA also showcased its efforts in identifying more than \$100 million in cost savings and efficiencies, including a 10% regional fare increase. Board materials are posted on the RTA website.

The RTA is working with policy makers at all levels of government to develop sustainable funding solutions and improve the system for all riders. Transit stakeholders interested in a more active role in advocating for sustainable transit funding can sign up to be a <u>Iransit Champion</u> to help bring about the legislative changes needed to support transit at this pivotal moment.

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Local leaders support sustainable transit funding, raise concerns about consolidation

As conversations on transit funding and reform continue in Springfield ahead of the fiscal cliff, local elected officials across the region have raised their voices on the need to fully fund transit operations and preserve regional, consensus-based decision making in transit governance. Four regional councils of government—the Northwest Municipal Conference, DuPage Mayors and Managers Conference, McHenry County Council of Governments, and the Barrington Area Council of Governments—have passed resolutions that call on the legislature to enable sustainable funding for transit operations and pursue reforms that increase efficiency, accountability, and coordination. The resolutions express opposition to full consolidation as proposed in the Metropolitan Mobility Act, raising concerns about the costs and complexity of a consolidation process that could delay progress on needed service improvements and reduce local perspectives in transit decision making.

Pace Board Greenlights Next Step for Regional Day Pass

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Pace Board Reviews Key Transit Investments and ReVision Project Update

ARLINGTON HEIGHTS, IL – At today's Board of Directors meeting, Pace leadership discussed critical investments in the agency's transit network, including an update on Pace's ongoing *ReVision* network restructuring project and a Vanpool vehicle procurement.

The meeting's main focus was an update from Jarrett Walker and Associates (JWA) on the next phase of *ReVision*, Pace's comprehensive network restructuring initiative. Following extensive public outreach, Pace is moving forward with the development of a Draft Network Plan, which will shape the future of suburban transit service.

"This is a crucial moment for Pace. With sustainable funding, we can enhance frequency, expand access, and create a more connected transit network. Without it, we face the risk of a skeleton system that limits opportunity and mobility," said Pace Executive Director Melinda Metzger. Board members provided feedback on two funding scenarios:

- A short-term, status quo scenario that streamlines existing routes within current funding levels.
- A growth scenario that assumes additional funding, allowing for expanded service, particularly in coverage-oriented areas while targeting investments in high-ridership routes.

"ReVision is a once-in-a-generation opportunity to realign suburban transit service with the way people travel today," said Metzger. "We are committed to balancing ridership growth with expanded coverage to best serve our diverse communities."

The Draft Network Plan will be developed in the coming months, with additional public outreach planned before finalizing recommendations later this year.

Also at today's meeting, the Pace Board of Directors approved the purchase of 125 new minivans, a major boost for the agency's <u>Vanpool Program</u>. The vans will replace aging vehicles that have exceeded their useful life, ensuring continued access to this valuable shared-ride program.
