

Kane County Division of Transportation Ride in Kane Sponsor Information

Eligible participants are individuals residing in Kane County considered low-income based on 150% of the Federal Poverty Guidelines (see table below) traveling to employment or employment related activities.

Forms of proof of income accepted:

- Unemployment Compensation benefit letter
- Supplemental Nutritional Assistance Benefits letter SNAP or TANF
- Section 8 voucher or lease from HUD location
- Social Security benefit letter
- Medicaid Healthcare coverage
- Federal Tax Return 1040 page 1. If no return was filed, please submit Federal form 4506-T to the IRS and submit IRS response

Proof of income status will be verified annually by the Ride in Kane Coordinator.

Kane County will provide up to **two months cash fare subsidy** for newly registered riders. Please contact the RIK Coordinator for more information.
