

Countywide Installation of Recessed Reflective Pavement Markers to Begin the Week of April 14th

April 7, 2025 - Installation of Recessed Reflective Pavement Markers will begin the week of April 14, 2025, weather permitting, on approximately 131.5 miles of various County highways. The work will begin on the north side of the County and continue toward the south until all work is complete. Recessed reflective pavement markers aid in providing visibility of the lane lines for the motoring public. The majority of the work is anticipated to be completed by the end of June, weather dependent. A few locations will be completed in the fall of 2025.

Temporary daily lane closures will be required Monday through Saturday from 7:30 AM to 5:00 PM to safely accomplish this work. The north to south progression may change if weather impacts dictate alternate installation sequences. Flaggers will route drivers around the installation crews in order to safely accomplish the required work.

Motorists should expect delays while traveling through the work areas, consider alternate routes and expect additional commute time. Motorists are asked to reduce their speed, watch for construction workers and vehicles entering and leaving the site and obey flaggers and traffic control devices.
